



Mid-Course HSC Examination Timetable 2015

Instructions

- Misreading of this timetable is not an acceptable excuse for non-attendance at an examination.
- Times shown are starting and finishing times for each exam and include reading time – generally 5 minutes unless otherwise indicated. You **MUST** be at the venue 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the exam. If you arrive late for an exam you can still enter the exam room after speaking with a supervisor however, no additional time will be given to compensate for your lateness.
- If you are ill on the day of the exam please ring the school and ask to be put through to student services – notify staff of your name and TG number and the exam you will miss so that a message can be passed onto the relevant coordinator – the usual assessment procedures then apply.
- Seating at all exam venues will be in **Board of Studies numerical order**. Some exams are in several different venues. Before the exam check with your teacher as to which venue you will be in. Lists will also be placed on the Year 12 student notice board outside the Student Office.
- You **MUST** have your **Student ID** card with you, to be placed on the desk during the exam.
- You **MUST** bring your **barcode labels** to every examination to attach to answer booklets
- Upon entry to the exam venue, **silence** is to be maintained.
- **Wrist watches** must be taken off and placed on the desk
- As with HSC Exams, **Mobile Phones and MP3s are not permitted** in the exam rooms under **any** circumstances. If a student is found to have a phone there will be an immediate notification to the Board of Studies regarding **Malpractice and a zero recorded** for the task regardless of whether the phone is being used. In fact, students who engage in any form of Malpractice can expect to have zero awarded for the examination and the malpractice registered with the Board of Studies – this has very serious consequences in relation the HSC internal assessment mark and ranks lodged with the Board of Studies at the end of the course
- Pens, pencils, erasers and any other required equipment can only be taken into the exam room in a clear plastic container, and must be free of added notations and drawings.
- Students are asked to use **black pen** only as per Board of Studies requirements
- Students **are** permitted to bring a clear plastic bottle of water into the exam room.
- Full school uniform must be worn during exams.
- Students will not be permitted to leave the exam venue prior to the finish time of the examination

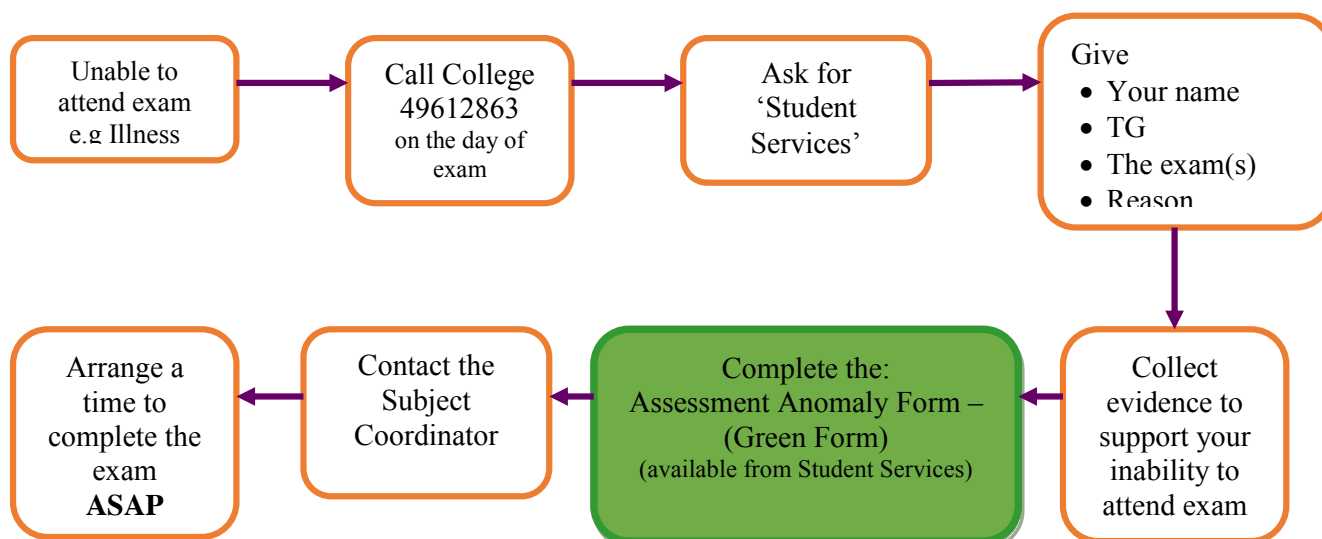

REMINDER – ILLNESS / MISADVENTURE APPEALS

APPLICATIONS FOR ILLNESS / MISADVENTURE CAN ONLY BE LODGED IF YOU ACTUALLY SIT FOR THE EXAMINATION – YOU MUST NOTIFY THE EXAMINATION SUPERVISOR PRIOR TO COMMENCING THE EXAMINATION THAT YOU ARE FEELING ILL OR THAT YOU HAVE BEEN AFFECTED BY AN UNFORESEEN EVENT SO THAT THE SUPERVISOR CAN MONITOR YOU DURING THE EXAMINATION. YOU WILL NEED SUPPORTING EVIDENCE E.G. A DR. CERTIFICATE TO SUPPORT YOUR APPLICATION. THE ILLNESS / MISADVENTURE FORM MUST BE LODGED WITH THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL – DEAN OF STUDIES WITHIN 48 HOURS OF SITTING FOR THE EXAMINATION. NOTE THAT ILLNESS / MISADVENTURE DOES NOT APPLY TO ONGOING ILLNESSES (E.G. GLANDULAR FEVER UNLESS THERE IS A 'FLARE UP' OF THE CONDITION IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE EXAMINATION) OR DOMESTIC SITUATIONS
