A Message from the Principal

Dear Members of the SFX Community,

ROLE MODELS

We live in a country where sportspeople tend to quickly become heroes and role models, whether they deserve it or not. Accolades are received for what is or might be achieved rather than for the depth of character underpinning such achievements.

As a result of this prevailing attitude, I could not resist the temptation to speak at last week's Zoom assembly with the students about the remarkable Ash Barty. Like so many other Australians, I had watched her Wimbledon final into the early hours of the morning and witnessed her authentic humility upon attaining the summit of international tennis achievement.

Yet one senses her real achievement is in knowing what is important. In her post-match interview, she reflected that "it's more important to be a good person than it is a good tennis player. So, I think that's always my priority, making sure that I'm a good human being."

In a world obsessed with outcomes, it seems to me that Ash Barty provides us with a very different definition of 'success' and, in so doing, displays characteristics of a true champion and wonderful role model. As a community, we can only hope to inspire our students to aspire toward prioritising being 'a good human being' – such learning is at the core of everything we do.

COVID-19 UPDATE

While Term Three has commenced quite smoothly at the College, we remain alert to the continual changes in our health landscape, particularly with regards to the risks posed by the latest COVID-19 Delta variant. I would remind all families of the need to exercise vigilance in this domain through physical distancing, ongoing commitment to sanitisation practices, utilising masks, and by remaining at home if you are unwell. While we currently do not have any immediate Covid-19 concerns, there have been a few students present to the College with cold-like symptoms who have been concerned that they are missing too much work. While we appreciate this concern and applaud the commitment to learning, there remains the need to consciously care for the greater good in such circumstances. Please remain home and advise your teachers of the reason for your absence and your desire to not miss any work. It is simply not an appropriate risk to take at this point in time.

FOCUS ON THAT WHICH YOU CAN CONTROL

While the changing Covid landscape can be a considerable distraction for our students, we have reminded all members of our community to focus on that which we can control. For Year 12 students, this means being dedicated to Trial Exam preparation and completion of major works, while for Year 11 students it will mean establishing effective routines to prepare for their end of course examinations. I was delighted to receive a request from a Year 12 student last week who sought to remove distractions by requesting that we might extend the timeframe of after-school study on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday each week as we approach exams. As a result of this request, after-school study will now operate until 5pm on each of these days. The number of students utilising this opportunity is growing exponentially and it is wonderful to see.

The Covid-19 situation continues to create uncertainty in terms of planned events and activities. This guide seeks to provide you with an overview of the psychological testing process that you will undertake when applying to join the ADF. The ADF psychological testing process includes:

• A General Ability Test

Depending on the role applied for, you may also be required to sit additional testing, such as:

- Testing for Officer entry
- Testing for Aircrew and Aviation related roles
- Testing for Other Specialist Occupations.

This guide will provide you with an idea of what to expect during psychological testing, and hints and tips to help prepare you for this testing.

Work Projects and Community Connections

Life Skills Creative Art's students have been experimenting with the cyanotype "blueprint" process to make designs on fabric and paper. They began gathering objects and arranging them into mandalas and other designed compositions based on the shape, texture and size of the materials. Students were then tasked with assembling photos, objects, drawings or text, to depict an aspect of their own identity. Each given a rectangular wall hanging made from calico, students had to construct their design, expose it to the sun then wash and watch the vibrant Prussian Blue coloured print emerge.







In Week 1, they visited "Gammin; story of a mob in Cyanotype" an exhibition at Lake Macquarie Art Gallery. It was amazing to see this process at a large scale; a huge fabric and sound installation made by young indigenous students from Clontarf Academy in Toronto, NSW.





Students have also engaged in a practical textiles and design project in Life Skills Technology involving designing and hand sewing a Charity Bear. They were able to choose their design and hand sew a unique felt stuffed toy for a keepsake or to gift to a loved one. Throughout this unit students developed skills in simple stitching, sewing a button, using a pattern, cutting skills, threading a needle and tying a knot. The results were impressive, and all the students were proud of their achievements.






