# A message from the Principal

Dear Year 6 parents, carers and students.

Welcome to the second edition of our Year 7 2024 **Newsletter - Keeping** Connected. We hope families are enjoying the wonderful journey



of Year 6, and participating in all that is on offer in your Year 6 communities. We wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the transition processes occurring in our College, amidst the excitement that is building for the arrival of our first Year 7 cohort.

# **Enrolment update**

After initially planning for 90 students in our first cohort, we have been overwhelmed by the demand for places in our community. After careful consideration and Diocesan consultation, we have made the decision to expand beyond our original scope and will now be anticipating the arrival of more than 130 students in Year 7 in 2024. The significant advantage of this is in our capacity to provide Catholic education for more families, but importantly it will also provide us with a scope for wider course offerings and possibilities in the years ahead. We are delighted that your children will be joining us in a school of choice for so many as we commence this journey together.

#### Year 6 visits

A central focus of Term 2 has been our staff visits to our Year 6 pathway schools to engage with your children in their current learning. There are great pictures and comments on pages 3 and 4 of this newsletter from some of these visits, and we certainly hope the students have enjoyed this opportunity to connect with our staff as much as our team has enjoyed meeting and working with them.

These visits have provided a significant connection between our schools and will assist us in making the transition to high school as seamless as possible. Importantly, these occasions have provided valuable insights into pedagogy, whilst beginning the vital development of relationships which are at the core of all great learning journeys. We extend our thanks to these wonderful schools and their staff who have so generously made these experiences possible!

### Year 7 spaces at SFX

One of our key determinations early in the transition process was the pursuit of dedicated learning and recreation spaces for our Year 7 students. Creating a safe and engaging environment is crucial to the educational journey. We are currently in the final stages of planning for our designated Year 7 rooms as well as a new space in the yard designated for Year 7 recreation and physical education. Construction of these projects is due to commence in Term 3.

As we approach the second half of the year, there is a real sense of anticipation and excitement within our College. Thank you for choosing to be a part of this new adventure.


