During our STEM/Cultural/Creative Arts Day students were able to engage and participate in a range of activities. The day started off with a bang and students moved through a series of activities including working with the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle Aspire Team to complete dancing and percussion activities. In this rotation they also participated in a First Australian's Knowledge Session. In this session students learnt about tools for hunting, customs and of course some Indigenous games were played which were a lot of fun! Finally, the third workshop was titled 'Supporting One-Another' and this required students to look deeper within their understandings of all people within our community and understanding that as a society, we all need to be treated through a 'Socially Just Lens'.

The afternoon saw our students participate in a STEM activity. This had students work in groups of a maximum of three to create a structure.
