HOLY WEEK

Last week a significant number of our staff had the blessed opportunity to undertake some professional development with Br Tony Leon on the Student Retreat programme that we offer to Year 12. The day was filled with wonderful wisdom, grace and insight and reminded us of just how vital and significant this event is in our College calendar.

As part of our reflective journey on the day, Br Tony recalled for us the profound words of Persian poet Rumi who suggested that "silence is the language of God, all else is poor translation." Br Tony emphasised that Retreat will be filled with lots of energy, stories, connectedness and fun, but it must also have moments of silence where the language of truth and wisdom may be discerned. Part of our Retreat programme recognises that our lives tend to be too busy, and this can prevent us from growing fully.





ATAR explained without all the jargon.

It is important to remember that the ATAR tells you about where you are placed among your cohort (your rank); it is not a mark out of 100 or a percentage. Its only purpose is to help universities select students for their courses.

Of the 54,894 NSW students who received an ATAR in 2020:

- only 46 students (less than 1%) received an ATAR of 99.95
- 50.3% received an ATAR of at least 70.00
- 65.6% received an ATAR of at least 60.00.

Grace HewittAthletics and Surf Life Saving

Grace moved to Australia from Ireland when she was 6 year old. When she commenced school, the friends she connected with were part of a running group, so she joined them in their weekly running sessions. Grace's parents signed her and her siblings up to Fingal Bay Surf Club in order for them to extend their friendships but also to develop the necessary surf skills and knowledge to ensure their safety when venturing into the surf. Her introduction to these two sports led to a passion for both athletics, in particularly running and surf lifesaving. In 2011 at age 8 Grace started competing in the NSW Surf Lifesaving and Little Athletics State Championships.

Grace loves both athletics and surf lifesaving. She still competes in both events. In athletics she excels in the 100 and 200m and is *currently ranked 5th in Australia in the U/20s 100 and 8th in the 200m*. In the surf lifesaving domain Grace competes in the beach sprint and flags events. *At the recent NSW Surf Lifesaving Championships, Grace was placed first in the U/17 + Open Beach Sprint and came second in U/17 Flags*. Both disciplines take up most of Grace's free time however she sees this as a benefit to her as both sports complement each other. She explained that when she trains and competes on the track, she is building her speed and technique, and when she trains and competes on the sand, she is building her strength and power which are the necessary components required to be a good sprinter. Another aspect of surf lifesaving that she really enjoys is that she has learnt about the skills and knowledge related to surf awareness and safety and most importantly knowing that these skills will enable you to help and possibly save others.

Grace obviously is a gifted sportswoman, and her talents extend to other sports as well. She competed in NSW State Touch and Rugby competitions in 2018 and 2019. However, like many elite athletes she made the decision in 2020 to focus on her two loves – athletics and surf lifesaving. This paid dividends for Grace, when in the 2020 NSW Surf Lifesaving Championships, she was the first girl to win both the Youth and Open Beach Sprints. A fantastic achievement!

Success requires a commitment to training and she often makes sacrifices in other areas of her life. She does not have much time to socialise with friends outside of school, as most of her time is spent training and attending to schoolwork. Grace trains 4 times a week either on the track, grass and stairs. As well, she undertakes gym work where her focus is on developing her strength and conditioning. Not content to sit around Grace also has a part time job that involves working twice a week.

Grace indicated that schoolwork is very important to her and she endeavours to complete everything to the best of her ability. She tries her best to catch up on any schoolwork or study usually in the mornings, in the College library, as well as completing all work during class time. She values education and therefore has implemented several strategies so that she can do well in her HSC. These include, creating and sticking to a study timetable, seeking the

help of her teachers and using any spare time to catch up on some work. She finds that a balance between sport, school and work keeps her level-headed and enhances her overall wellbeing.

Grace's number one goal is to improve on her personal best times in athletics, and in 2021 qualify for the World Junior Track and Field Championships to be held in Kenya. (There is a very high chance it will be cancelled but she is still aiming to qualify. Grace is 0.02 seconds off qualifying for the 100m and 0.17 seconds off the 200m. Long term she would like to represent Australia at either an Olympics and/or World Championships.

Grace will be extremely busy over the next three weeks as both Athletics and Surf Lifesaving seasons come to a close. She has been selected in the NSW team that will compete in the Australian Athletics Championships to be held in Sydney from the 12th- 21st April. Grace will compete in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay. She will also compete at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships which will be held from 16th – 24th April on the Sunshine Coast. Grace will compete in the beach sprints for her club.


